

YARROW WHITE

Achillea millefolium



- Common Yarrow is an erect perennial plant that produces one to several stems anywhere from 0.2 to 1m in height.
- Yarrow produces small white flowers.
- Leaves are evenly distributed along the stem, with the leaves near the middle and the bottom of the stem being the largest.
- The leaves are 5-20 cm long, almost feathery and arranged spirally on the stems.
- Yarrow is a drought tolerant species of which there are several different ornamental cultivars
- Seeds require light for germination, so optimal germination occurs when planted no deeper than ¼ inch.
- The seeds also require a germination temperature of 18-24 Degrees.
- Yarrow responds best to soil that is poorly developed and well drained.
- The plant has a relatively short life, but may be prolonged by dividing the plant every other year, and planting 12 -18 inches apart.
- Yarrow may suffer from mildew or root rot if not planted in a well drained soil.
